" A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE DELIVERY OF MEAT SERVICES WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF PASACAO, CAMARINES SUR"

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 137 provides for the Implementing Rules and Regulations governing the devolution of certain powers and functions of the National Meat Inspection Commission (NMIC) to the Local Government Units pursuant to R.A. 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991;


WHEREAS, Section 17 of RA 7160 provides for the establishment of public slaughterhouse as one of the basis services and facilities to be undertaken by cities and municipalities;

WHEREAS, Section 447 (A) (3) (VII) and (5) (II) (IV) and similar paragraph of Section 452 of Republic Act No. 7160, provides that the Sangguniang Bayan and Sangguniang Panglungsod shall enact ordinances that shall regulate the sale of meat, fish vegetables, fruits, fresh dairy products and other food staff for human consumption, establish and regulate the construction and operation of public market, slaughterhouse or animal corrals or grant franchise to any person to establish and operate the same as maybe allowed by existing laws, and to levy, assess, collect taxes, fees and charges as maybe necessary for those purposes.

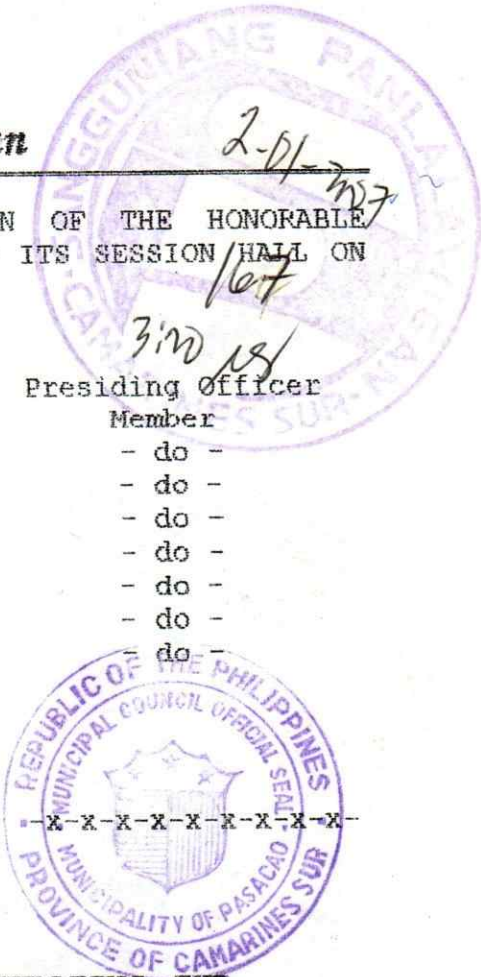
WHEREFORE, premises considered and upon motion of Honorable Coun. Honorio C. Flora, Jr. and unanimously seconded, be it-

RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved to approve an ordinance regulating the delivery of meat services within the municipality of Pasacao, Camarines Sur.

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 07

**" AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE DELIVERY OF MEAT SERVICES
WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF PASACAO, CAMARINES SUR"**

BE IT ORDAINED by this Honorable Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled, that: -


SECTION 1. MEAT INSPECTION

- I.1. All food animals should only be slaughtered in the Municipal Slaughterhouse must undergo Ante-Mortem and Post-Mortem Inspection by the Municipal Veterinarian and/or Municipal Meat Inspector and/or its duly accredited/authorized representative;
- I.2. Before any animal is slaughtered, a permit to slaughter shall be secured from the Municipal Mayor through the Municipal Veterinarian and/ or the Municipal Meat Inspector;
- I.3. The condemnation of the carcass as herein provide shall not be in lieu of, but shall be in addition to, the penalties provided in this ordinance;
- I.4 Except those prohibited by Executive Order No. 626 dated November 19, 1980, all carabaos and bufaloes shall be given a permit to slaughter, provided it has passed the Ante-Mortem Examination and accompanied by relevant documents. Likewise, permit to slaughter shall be granted to the owner of a male and female cattle not prohibited by NMIC Administrative Order No. 11 dated October 14, 1986;
- I.5 The Ante-Mortem and Post-Mortem Inspection of livestock and poultry shall be governed by NMIC Administrative Order No. 6, Series of 1975.
- I.6 The Municipality's role, duties and responsibilities shall strictly be governed by Executive Order No. 137 of November 1993.

SECTION 2. OPERATION AND MANAGEMENT OF SLAUGHTERHOUSE

- 2.1. The operation and management of Municipal Slaughterhouse shall be under the supervision of the Office of the Mayor thru the Municipal Veterinarian or the Municipal Agriculturist;
- 2.2. A utility worker shall be employed / detailed to maintain sanitation and care of animals temporary confine in the holding pen;
- 2.3. A composite Task Force shall be created who will conduct raid and confiscation of clandestine slaughtered animals;
- 2.4. No person shall be allowed to work in the slaughterhouse without proper training and/or license;

- 2.5. Meat Handlers should be licensed before engaging in meat trade;
- 2.6. The Office of the Mayor thru the Municipal Treasurer shall assign personnel from the Municipal Treasurer's Office who will collect the fees and charges in the Slaughterhouse;

SECTION 3. COLLECTION OF FEES AND CHARGES

All fees and charges shall be collected before the meat is dispatched to the Market.

- 3.1. To prescribed fees for Ante-Mortem and Post Mortem Inspection of livestock and poultry in the municipality of Pasacao to prevent the trafficking of diseased meat and the outbreak of foot and mouth disease among hogs in Pasacao, and to ensure that all the carcasses and the edible offals of livestock and poultry are properly inspected before they may be sold for public consumption in Pasacao.

- 3.2. Definition of Terms.

Livestock - refers to domestic animals raised for meat and offered for sale to the public.

Poultry - refers to domestic fowls raised for meat and offered for sale to the public;

Ante-Mortem Inspection - refers to examination of livestock / poultry before it is slaughtered / dressed;

Hot Meat - refers to carcasses or meat of livestock / poultry slaughtered / dressed in an unauthorized or private / backyard slaughterhouse or in any place other than the Municipal Slaughterhouse and slaughterhouse accredited by the National Meat Inspection Commission;


Allowable Meat - refers to meat slaughtered at the Municipal Slaughterhouse accredited by the National Meat Inspection Commission may be sold for public consumption in Pasacao;

Unauthorized Slaughter - refers to any building / place used for slaughtering of livestock and/or poultry without proper permit, license and/or clearance from the concerned national and/or local government agencies.

- 3.3. It is hereby prescribed the following Ante-Mortem and Post-Mortem Inspection fees to all livestock and poultry prior slaughter/dressing to determine the presence of disease/abnormal condition:

<u>SPECIES</u>	<u>FEE / HEAD</u> <u>ANTE-MORTEM</u>	<u>FEE PER KILO</u> <u>POST-MORTEM</u>
Cattle	5.00	0.30
Carabao / Buffalo	5.00	0.30
Horse	5.00	0.30
Swine / Hog	3.00	0.25
Goat / Sheep / Deer	1.50	0.15
Poultry	0.50	0.15

3.4. Legal Sale of Meat

Only meat slaughtered at the Municipal Slaughterhouse may be sold for public consumption in Pasacao.

3.5. Disposition of Hot Meat

- Meat sold or being offered for sale in violation of Section 1 and 3.1 above shall be deemed as "Hot Meat". It shall be confiscated and, if fit for human consumption, donated to charitable or penal institutions. Otherwise, it shall be condemned and disposed of accordingly.
- Carcasses found in any unauthorized slaughterhouse shall be confiscated and disposed of in accordance with the preceding paragraph.

3.6. Duty of Meat Vendors

Meat vendors shall present to meat inspectors of the Municipal Government of Pasacao upon the latter's demand the original copies of the official receipts and other pertinent papers covering the meat they are selling. Failure to present such documents shall be sufficient proof to classify the meat as "Hot Meat".

SECTION 4. ISSUANCE OF MEAT HANDLERS LICENSE.

As provided in Section 2.5 of this ordinance, applicants must undergo a short seminar to be conducted by the National Meat Inspection Commission as essential requirement before issuance of license. Likewise, medical certificate, police clearance and mayor's permit must be secured.

The license is non-transferable and the said person is only authorized to operate in the specified areas approved in the application.

SECTION 5. RENEWAL AND REVOCATION OF LICENSE.


The license is valid for one year only and application for renewal should at least be one (1) month prior to the expiration date of the license. Likewise, the license may be revoked for violation of Meat Inspection guidelines and at anytime if the interest of the consuming public of the municipality so requires.

SECTION 6. VIOLATION AND PENALTIES.

Any person, either for himself or in behalf of another person, who shall slaughter animals which have not been submitted for Ante-Mortem inspection prescribed in this ordinance or who shall store, transport, sell or otherwise dispose of food carcasses, organs or parts thereof which has not previously inspected and passed or have been found upon inspection to be unfit for human consumption, or who shall contravene or violate any of the provisions of this ordinance as it involves public health safety, or who shall falsify, forge, counterfeit, alter, deface or destroy any certificates, pass, tags and other papers issued or marked by virtue of this ordinance, shall be metted with the following penalties:

1st Offense- a fine of not less than P 500.00 but not more than P 1,000.00 or an imprisonment of not less than one (1) month but not more than two (2) months or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court;

2nd Offense- a fine of not less than P 1,500.00 but not more than P 2,000.00 or an imprisonment of not less than three (3) months but not more than four (4) months or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court;

3rd Offense - a fine of P 2,500.00 or an imprisonment of not less than five (5) months but not more than six (6) months or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court;

SECTION 7. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE-

If for any reason, any section or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgement shall not affect or impair the other provisions or parts thereof which shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. REPEALING CLAUSE










All ordinances, rules and regulations inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.


SECTION 9. EFFECTIVITY


This ordinance shall take effect 30 days after publications in a local newspaper of general circulation.
